Annual walk encourages people to use their voice

ST. CATHARINES — Donna Christie had one message for the hundreds of people gathered at the annual Take Back the Night Walk: speak up, even if your voice shakes.

"We don't often think of our voices as being the powerful, volatile thing it is," she said.

Christie works at the Niagara Regional Sexual Assault Centre and has been involved as an organizer of the walk for a number of years. This year's event, held outside the St. Catharines Public Library on Sept. 22, saw a large crowd gather to hear Christie, as well as representatives from Brock University and the
