Minaret will top Kanata North mosque

Design sketches released as part of application to city

Kanata North will have a new landmark - a minaret about 17 metres tall - if a rezoning request is approved by the city.

The request has been filed by the Kanata Muslim Association, and the accompanying documents show how a new mosque will look once it is completed, although the association says there may still be some changes.

The prayer hall, and a multipurpose community centre with meeting rooms, a kitchen and washrooms are planned for 351 Sandhill Rd., near the corner of Klondike Road.

The association's architect writes that "an important design intent is to mitigate the building's impact on the streetscape and develop a welcoming approach to the site."
