## NEW OWNER WANTS RESIDENTS OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING TO LEAVE AND SIGN N11 FORM

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A mass "renoviction" has residents at a downtown Galt affordable apartment complex fearing they will be out on the streets.

In a text message recently sent to Tiger Lofts apartment residents by the superintendent. and seen by the Times, the tenants were told there was a new owner of the former Tiger Brand Knitting Ltd. building at 35 Water St. S., and all of them had to be moved out by Oct. 31, 2023, so the building could undergo renovations. Each tenant would receive a \$10,000 compensation package.


The superintendent further

informed tenants they would have to sign a N11 form — which states the landlord and tenant both want to end the lease within a week.

This news blindsided some of the tenants, as the 54-unit building was developed in 2008 by

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
