Pledge of 8,000 housing units by 2031 approved by Council

Council last week approved a new Housing Pledge which, if brought to fruition, will lead to the creation of 8,000 new housing units by 2031.

1), Wendy Gaertner (Ward 3), and John

"Along with the target of 8,000 new housing units, the Housing Pledge articulates the various efforts the Town is making to address the housing crisis. These include, but are not limited to, the inclusion of new strategies and actions The pledge was approved on a 4-3 on affordable and attainable housing vote, with Councillors Ron Weese (Ward in the Town's updated Official Plan, as well as streamlined processes to facilitate

the timely review and approval of development applications and permits," said the Town in a statement following the September 26 Council meeting.

While Council members did not dispute the need for more residential units to address the housing crisis, the devil was very much in the details, including funding.

Strong Mayor powers rejected by Council, but likely coming anyway

Aurora lawmakers have rejected Strong Mayor powers on paper, but the decision is not likely to change the outcome.

Last week, Council, upon a motion from Ward 1 Councillor Ron Weese, formally rejected Strong Mayor powers, which could be a significant shift in how municipal decisions could be made going forward.

This fall, Heads of Council in nearly 30
