# Syrian refugees to settle in Brant

Brantford will be receiving Syrian refugees. When and how many isn't yet known but the city is beginning to prepare, Mayor Chris Friel said on Friday, following a community prayer service at the Brantford Mosque.

"This is going to happen very fast," he said in an interview.

Brantford's director of social services attended a regional meeting early last week with Emergency Management Ontario, which is overseeing the settlement process for thousands of refugees coming to the province.
