## Motorists, pedestrians both need to be vigilant, police say

NORTH PERTH - Although new legislation on pedestrian crosswalks has little impact on Listowel and area, OPP are still advising motorists and pedestrians to keep their eyes open for each other.

Starting Jan. 1, 2016, new legislation went into effect requiring drivers and cyclists to yield the whole roadway at pedestrian-activated crossovers, and wait until all pedestrians have made it clear to the other side. The legislation only applies to pedestrian crossovers identified by specific signs and lights, but OPP media relations officer Const. Kees Wijnands said that Listowel has no such pedestrian crossovers.

"It doesn't refer to any other type of crosswalk," he said. "As soon as they don't have that [sign] the legislation doesn't apply to those crosswalks."

Wijnands said the legislation was slightly ambiguous when it was first announced, but the actual scope of the new law is quite small, and only applies to large urban centres.

"When this was put out, it made it seem like a pedestrian crossing anywhere at a crosswalk, you'd have to wait until they make the complete cross," Wijnands said. "That's not the case unless they're at those particular crosswalks.

However, that's not to say North Perth has nothing to worry about when it comes to pedestrian safety.
