Barn blaze near St. Volodymyr's Tuesday

Oakville fire crews responded to a Tuesday evening blaze in a storage barn near St. Volodymyr Cultural Centre — the sixth fire

in Oakville in the past month.

With the blaze brought under control, area roads were expected to remain closed well

into early Wednesday morning as the fire investigation continued.

Firefighters arrived on the scene shortly

after 8 p.m. to find the barn fully engulfed in flames and heavy smoke in the area from the blaze, which ravaged a large barn apparently used as a storage facility near the local cultural centre, on Dundas Street near see Storage on p.7
